## State of Coast

- Typically 200-250 attendees. Had 500 people registered this year.
- OAH session had ~130 attendees
  - o Indicates interest, engagement in the issue.

## What we will take forward with us from 2020?

- Remote platforms - REALLY increased participation! Engagement, hopefully.

## Fishermen-scientist roundtable

- Fishermen as an "audience" and as collaborators are critical to us understanding and making progress on OAH/ocean health.
- Shelby attended both 2016, 2017. Focus on what we see as outcomes of these:
  - o George Waldbusser pink shrimp study
  - o Jack/Francis CHRP study on crab
  - o Aaron Galloway D-crab
- Agenda:
  - o Review "what has come out of past RT's, collaborations"
  - o Salinity station in Yaq Bay
- Avoiding coastal fatigue (roundtables, surveys, etc.)
  - o U of O project Carolyn Fish (cartographer specializing in maps as communication tool; collab with Sam Siedlecki)
  - o We want to include people, AND, we don't want to turn this into a "taking" of data/information from fishermen.

## SAFE (Scientist and Fishermen Exchange) - OAH roundtable?

- Is it still being convened?
- RT is an offshoot - or derivative.
- Is Angee Doerr leading it? Not active, but it is her position who led it.
- Jack thinks it IS the same thing.

## Issues that are pressing to fishermen?

- Spatial issues
  - o Aquaculture - oyster industry connects spatial and ocean conditions issues.
  - o OSW
  - o D-Crab/Whales?

## Francis

- RT - not much to add. Keep "value-add to fishermen" at top of the list.

## Legislative Session

- Educate legislators? Yes. We want to do this soon-ish.
- But around what? What is the ask?
  - o Caren - we should participate in events, given the opportunity (provide updates)
  - o Susan - agrees - waiting might be wise.
  - o Francis - are we providing messages/identifying messengers? Or are we doing the presentations?
    - Kotek, Courtney, Dembrow, Helm, Brock Smith,

- Susan agrees - we need to talk to legislators from valley and coast (not just the coastal caucus)
  - Susan happy to speak to seafood/coastal economy needs.
  - How do we connect with non-coastal legislators.
- Jack/Charlotte:
  - We can do BOTH coordinate and speak to messages.
  - Surfrider needs information from someone!

Next steps:

- Species infographic - really need this done.
- OAH Council/WG - needs to coordinate and curate the messages. Deliver to others who can advocate.
- We need to talk to people about how preparation for COVID, OAH will be win-win.
